The uniform policy for Karnack Independent School District is as follows:

NORMAL SCHOOL DAY

- 1. Navy and khaki uniform pants, uniform skirts, uniform jumpers, uniform capri's, uniform shorts. **The following items are prohibited**: overalls, long or short; cargo pants, long or short; or and pant with big pockets; spandex pants or spandex shorts.
- 2. White, light blue, navy or red polo style or oxford shirts with collars are permitted.
- 3. All students must wear acceptable shoes. <u>The following are acceptable shoes:</u> loafers, closed sneakers, and laced closed-in shoes, sandals with or without a strap are acceptable. (If gym shoes are not worn, students will not be able to participate in PE, please make sure that if acceptable shoes are not worn, that a pair is packed See Coach Deal if you have questions)
 - <u>The following are NOT acceptable shoes:</u> thongs, slides, house-shoes, and flip flops. Any exceptions to the shoe policy must be verified with a doctor's statement to the campus principal.
- 4. Belts must be worn with belt-looped garments.
- 5. Shirt-tails must be tucked in at all times while on campus. This includes before and after school, and while waiting for buses and private transportation.

Any student needing assistance for purchasing uniforms should contact the school Principal. Approval will be through the central office, not the campus level.

Uniforms are interchangeable. Students may choose from the navy, light blue, white, or red shirt to wear with the navy, or khaki uniform bottoms.

SPECIAL EVENTS OR OCCASIONS

- 1. School uniforms will be worn for all field trips unless otherwise permitted by the teacher or principal.
- 2. See Student/Parent Handbook for specific guidelines regarding non-uniform dress.

FRIDAYS (BEGINNING 2015-2016 SCHOOL YEAR)

- 1. Students may wear jeans with <u>a uniform or spirit shirt</u> on every Friday. Jeans must be plain, with no rips, tears, bleach spots, or other defects or colors.
- 2. Students will lose this privilege, if they have any discipline issues, or dress code violations for that week. *This will be at the teacher, or principal's discretion*.
